A Guide for Running Capitalism Lab on Mac

Capitalism Lab runs on Windows

In order to run Capitalism Lab, which is a native Windows application, on macOS, you will need to set up a virtual machine.

A virtual machine (VM) allows you to run another operating system on top of your existing one.

While there are various VM providers available for macOS, we recommend using VMware Fusion Player, which is free for educational and personal uses.

Pro Apps are now Free for Personal Use and Licensed for Commercial Use

The most exciting part is that Fusion Pro and Workstation Pro will now have two license models. We now provide a Free Personal Use or a Paid Commercial Use subscription for our Pro apps. Users will decide based on their use case whether a commercial subscription is required.

This means that everyday users who want a virtual lab on their Mac, Windows or Linux computer can do so *for free* simply by registering and downloading the bits from the new download portal located at support.broadcom.com

Customers who use Fusion and Workstation at/for work require a paid commercial subscription, which can be purchased through an authorized Broadcom Advantage partner. More on that below.

Install the downloaded VMware Fusion Player



After the installation, open VMFusion Player from Command Centre



Select "Install from disc or image"



Download and Install Windows ISO for Your Mac

There are two types of Mac computers:

1. Intel-based Macs: For this type, you can download the ISO file directly from <u>Microsoft Windows website</u>.

2. Apple Silicon-based Macs (including M1, M2, and M3 series): For this type, you can obtain the ISO file from <u>our cloud drive</u>.
